BEACON OF HOPE**

Miep Gies (1909-2010) is one of the unsung heroes of the Holocaust. This petite, humble, Catholic woman helped hide Anne Frank and her family in the Netherlands during WWII. Miep provided them with food and other necessities. She linked them to the outside world. Her emotional support gave them a beacon of hope. Without the protection of Miep and her husband, Anne might not have survived to write her diary. After the Nazis arrested the Frank family, Miep discovered Anne's diary and protected it through the rest of the war. Had it not been for Miep Gies, Anne's story would have been lost to the world.
